and plants. For the purpose of our gardening emailer, we will quickly focus on the accessible edible sources for humans and then move on to the importance of Nitrogen for plants.

In humans, Nitrogen is vital for the production of proteins. Some of the best edible sources for humans are lettuce, radishes, spinach, and rhubarb. Dairy and meat products also contain nitrogen, but not at the amounts that the vegetables do.

Now for the plants; why do they need it and where do they get it? Nitrogen helps plants photosynthesize. Photosynthesis is a process that involves using energy from the sun to break down water and carbon dioxide. That breakdown then creates the sugar that feeds the plants. We view Nitrogen as a way to green up a plant. When a plant has used all of the Nitrogen available you will often see a yellowing or pale color to the leaves.

Plants absorb Nitrogen through their roots. That's where inoculation comes in. Inoculation helps certain plants, namely legumes, to fix nitrogen in the ground where it can be accessed more readily. Our Fix-N-Grow Granular Legume Inoculant treats a 40 foot row for \$3.99. You will sprinkle the natural beneficial soil bacteria to safely and naturally amend the soil. The bacteria helps take the Nitrogen in the soil and deliver it to the plant.
