Zone: 3

16-20" tall

- Bouquet in your garden
- Heavy bloomer
- Shorter nature is great for middle of



the
garden



Levi (asiatic) Lily

Zone: 3
44-48" tall

- Earlier bloom time
- Added interest with the two tones
- Combine with other white perennials for a beautiful moonlight garden

Felicia (oriental, double) Lily

Zone: 3



32-36" tall

- Pollen free
- Double the petals equals double the fun
- Soft pink petals with chartreuse colored center
- Slightly ruffled edges



True Emotion (fragrant) Lily

Zone: 3
16-20"

- Can tolerate part shade
- Shorter plant with massively large blooms
- Pure white set against a deep green leaf



Firebolt (oriental) Lily

Zone:3
36-38" tall

- Grrr!
How about this for a stunning color
- Blooms in late July to extend blooms in garden
- Combines beautifully with a deep yellow or blue

Facts Behind Triploid Apple Trees

Did you know most fruit trees are diploids? This means they have two sets of chromosomes, one from its mother and one its father. A triploid has an extra chromosome, which makes these trees unique.



A triploid apple tree is considered sterile. This is incredibly important because all

apple trees require a cross-pollinator for best production. If you come across a triploid don't view it as a "bad-apple," but be sure you have other pollinators available to aid pollination.

Triploids can more than make up for their sterile nature. They are typically known as the heritage apples with large fruiting capacity and actual fruit size.

Triploids are tough trees that can handle a variety of climates.

One of our staff members fell in love with the triploid Mutsu apple at an orchard a few years ago and has since had our department head on the hunt for one. Mutsu apples originated in the 1930's in Japan. Sometimes known in the United States as Crispin, the Mutsu apple looks like a large Golden Delicious. Actually one of its parents is the Golden Delicious, so it does share that sweet flavor.

Shrubs for Small Spaces

Monrovia's 2019 Suggestions

Haaga Rhododendron

Zone: 4 – 8

Look at those blooms! Very compact evergreen shrub that's perfect for small gardens in cool, damp climates. Up to 3' tall and wide. Partial sun.

Kelsey's Dwarf Red-Osier Dogwood

Zone 2 – 8

Bare red stems provide striking seasonal color to dormant winterscapes. In summer, makes a perfect lush green backdrop. Up to 30" tall and wide. Partial to full sun.

Crimson Kisses™ Weigela

Zone: 4 – 9

Such a colorful choice to back a flower border or to feature in front of larger shrubs! Blooms in spring, repeating through summer. Up to 3' tall and wide. Full sun.

Seaside Serenade® Bar Harbor Hydrangea

Zone: 3 – 8

New, compact form of Annabelle hydrangea with stems that hold up in heavy rain. Up to 4' tall and wide. Partial to full sun.
